It was moved by Petersen, seconded by Ferry, to authorize the Auditor to transfer the \$72,000 from the General Basic Fund that was to be used for Secondary Road Funding for FY2005 into the Insurance Reimbursement Fund to offset the expense for the County's partial self-funding of the health insurance deductibles and co-pays and to re-pay the General Fund the \$20,000 transfer to the Insurance Reimbursement Fund that was authorized at the November 17, 2004 meeting.
