RESOLUTION NO. 2005-7

A RESOLUTION OF THE SHELBY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ENDORSING AN APPLICATION FOR RISE PROGRAM FUNDS TO COMPLETE ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS AT THE INTERSECTION OF US HIGHWAY 59 AND 870^{TH} STREET

WHEREAS, Shelby County wishes to ensure the safety of all citizens traveling on its public roadways; and

WHEREAS, Shelby County proposes to widen US Highway 59 at its intersection with 870th Street to create turning lanes for access to 870th Street; and

WHEREAS, Shelby County Cookers, LLC, wishes to operate a 54,400 square foot facility to manufacture fully-cooked bacon products, creating 200 FTE jobs for Iowa within the first two years of operations; and

WHEREAS, RISE funds are requested in the amount of \$161,552.00 and will be matched by \$20,388.00 in cash and \$20,000.00 in engineering services from Shelby County for the roadway improvements projects; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project will greatly enhance traffic safety in the project area and improve access to prime industrial land; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is necessary for the company to meet its projected level of staffing and operations; and

WHEREAS, the RISE program was created to promote economic development in Iowa through the establishment, construction, improvement, and maintenance of roads and streets, and the widening of US Highway 59 at 870th Street qualifies as an eligible project.

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Shelby County, Iowa, that the Board of Supervisors hereby endorses the RISE Application dated February 15, 2005, to fund improvements to US Highway 59 at its intersection with 870th Street; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the intersection and road improvements will continue to be dedicated to public use; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the road improvements constructed under this project will be the jurisdictional responsibility of the State of Iowa and will be adequately maintained by the same entity.
