The Board of Supervisors of Shelby County, Iowa, met pursuant to law and rules of said board in regular session at 9:00 a.m. in the Supervisors Chambers of the Shelby County Courthouse with the following members present: Roger Schmitz, Chairman; Richard Ferry, Vice-Chairman; LaVon Christensen; and Marsha J. Carter, Clerk.

It was moved by Christensen, seconded by Ferry, to approve the agenda with the addition of the Assistant County Attorney Appointment AND the following items contained in the Consent Agenda:

- A. Minutes of December 29, 2006 & January 2, 2007
- B. Office Reports Sheriff & Recorder
- C. Committee Reports

It was moved by Ferry, seconded by Christensen, to approve the Claims of January 16, 2007, as listed in the Claims Register. AYES: Schmitz, Ferry, Christensen NAYES: None

It was moved by Christensen, seconded by Ferry, to approve the appointment of Daniel Feistner as Assistant County Attorney. AYES: Schmitz, Ferry, Christensen NAYES: None

The Resolution to pass the Master Matrix was presented. Carter reported that a petition with 96 signatures of residents in favor of the Board adopting the Master Matrix had been filed. Numerous county residents were present—both for and against. The following letter from Weihs Enterprises was placed on file:

"January 15, 2007

Dear Shelby County Supervisors,

During the past few months we have openly communicated and presented our vision of valueadded agricultural development for Shelby County. On January 2, 2007 representatives of our company, the Iowa Department of Natural Resources and E3 Biofuels (E3) presented a comprehensive plan for co-locating dairy cows, a methane digester and an ethanol plant. One of the reasons for considering Shelby County is the county leadership that has led to a reputation for being a livestock-friendly county.

As you now consider whether or not to adopt the Master Matrix, we request that you consider the impact such a decision will have on the dairy-digester-ethanol project. By not adopting the Master Matrix Shelby County will continue to be a county well-suited for this project and will keep the interest E3 has in Shelby County. At the present time Shelby County is the first choice location for E3. Adoption of the Master Matrix at this particular time will potentially cause the project to relocate. If this happens, Shelby County will lose out on the environmental benefits of the digester, the positive economic development, and the tax base this project will bring.

If the Master Matrix is not adopted at this time:

- Digester-Ethanol We can "keep the window open" on the dairy-digester-ethanol project. We pledge to do all we can to make a positive outcome and we promise to keep you informed along the way.
- No new Pork Facilities We also promise that no new or expanded hog buildings will be built by Natural Pork Production, or any other company owned or controlled by Weihs Enterprises, in Shelby County for a year beginning February 1, 2007. (This will correspond to the Master Matrix year.)

• Master Matrix Support – If we have not been successful in gaining the firm commitment for the digester-ethanol project during the next year we will not only not oppose the Master Matrix adoption one year from now we will support it.

We certainly hope that this approach provides a compromise you will support.

It was moved by Ferry, seconded by Schmitz, to not adopt the Master Matrix for 2007, to place the Weihs letter on file, and to review the Master Matrix again in January of 2008. AYES: Schmitz, Ferry NAYES: Christensen

Mark Grennan, Grennan & Associates, Omaha, NE, presented information regarding our annual property/casualty insurance renewal. As our consultant, he felt that we had the proper insurance coverage and The Agency's pricing was within market limits.

Paul Schmidt, representing the Garden Angels, appeared before the Board to present their grant application for funds to remodel Morgan Hall at the Fairgrounds. It was moved by Ferry, seconded by Christensen, to authorize the Chairman to sign the grant application to Endowment Funds of Southwest Iowa for \$15,000.00, with Carter noted as the fiscal agent. AYES: Schmitz, Ferry, Christensen NAYES: None

It was moved by Ferry, seconded by Christensen, to appoint Raymond Petersen, Elk Horn, to the Conservation Board, term expiring 12-31-2011. AYES: Schmitz, Ferry, Christensen NAYES: None

Carolyn Blum, Country Treasurer, appeared before the Board to update them on her plans to have her employees cross trained and her plans to rearrange her current office space to make the office operate more efficiently. It was moved Ferry, seconded by Christensen, to approve the expenses for the necessary updates to the office layout. AYES: Schmitz, Ferry, Christensen NAYES: None

Blum also asked for approval for a salary increase for one of her employees that had been recommended by the previous Treasurer. It was moved by Ferry, seconded by Christensen, to approve an increase for Debra McLaughlin from \$9.00 to \$10.00/Hour, effective January 24, 2007. AYES: Schmitz, Ferry, Christensen NAYES: None

It was moved by Christensen, seconded by Ferry to approve the Liquor License for the Club House (Golf Course), located at 1243 – 1600<sup>th</sup> St, Harlan. AYES: Schmitz, Ferry, Christensen NAYES: None

Blum also requested that the Resolution Naming Depositories be updated. Prior to January 1, 2007, some county funds had had not been approved by the Board. It was moved by Christensen, seconded by Ferry, to approve the following resolution, as recommended by the County Treasurer:
