The Supervisors considered the following resolution allowing a \$30,000.00 decrease on the secondary roads budget.

## RESOLUTION 2020-18 ENTRY RECORD OF THE COUNTY BUDGET AMENDMENT AND CONSIDERATION OF THE SHELBY COUNTY SECONDARY ROADS BUDGET AMENDMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020

BE IT REMEMBERED on this 28th day of MAY 2020, the Board of Supervisors met in scheduled session for the filing and considering of an amendment to the Shelby County Secondary Roads Budget for Fiscal Year 2020. THEREUPON, , on said day, the Secondary Roads Budget was taken up and considered. Therefore the decrease in the Secondary Roads budget by \$30,000.00 was then considered and THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that after the vote was taken after a motion by Haake and a second by Kenkel. The motion passed with Ayes from Haake, Kenkel and Parkhurst. No Nays were cast.

The Supervisors then considered and reviewed a policy governing the reopening of the Courthouse keeping employees safe as well as those having County business in the Shelby County Courthouse. The court system will govern the procedures required to open the offices on the third floor.

A first phase of basic opening keeping the doors locked and requiring patrons to call ahead to schedule business in an office. The doors will remain locked during this phase, scheduled to end June 16th. Beginning June 17<sup>th</sup> the lower level doors will be unlocked with elevator usage encouraged to the public. Loitering or visiting offices that persons do not have scheduled business in will be discouraged. The policy may be modified at any time to accommodate the changing horizon of this pandemic. A motion was made by Kenkel and seconded by Haake to approve the Courthouse reopening plan. The motion passed unanimously.
