The Shelby County Board of Supervisors met in an organizational session at 9:00 A.M. in the Supervisors Chamber in the Courthouse with the following members present: Steve Kenkel, Charles Parkhurst, Darin Haake, and Mark Maxwell, Clerk.

The residing Chair Charles Parkhurst asked that any conflict of interest be stated concerning any item on the agenda. None were stated.

A motion by Kenkel and a second by Haake was made to accept and abide by the following statement read aloud; " The Board of Supervisors shall meet as required by Chapter 331.213, Code of Iowa, and shall hold their first meeting of each year on the first day in January, which is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday and shall hold all subsequent meetings of the year as scheduled by the Board. All meetings of the Board shall be scheduled and conducted in compliance with Chapter 21. Regular meetings shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month." A unanimous vote was counted in favor of accepting the statement.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Kenkel, to approve Darin Haake as Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the 2021 calendar year. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Haake, to approve Steve Kenkel as Vice-Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the 2021 calendar year. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Kenkel, seconded by Parkhurst, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Kenkel to approve the minutes of December 15, 2020 and December 22<sup>nd</sup> 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Kenkel, to approve the claims of December 31st, 2020, as listed in the claims register. Motion carried unanimously.

Todd Valline was present to ask the Supervisors for an approval of the letter of support for the Shelby County Chamber of Commerce and Industry to be the agent for the Southwest Iowa Planning Councils business recovery procedures. There is funding available to the Chamber for the services the Chamber will provide with SWIPCO. Parkhurst made a motion for the Chamber to be the Shelby County representative to partner with SWIPCO in this arrangement. Parkhurst, Kenkel and Haake all voted in favor of approval of the partnership. Valline also noted that the recent holiday drawings were a success with five different businesses represented in the drawings and persons from all over the Shelby County area were represented in the winners drawn at random. Director Valline also said they are currently accepting nominations for the yearly Chamber Recognition Awards.

Brandon Burmeister, Shelby County Engineer, presented the following resolution to update Secondary Roads employee's safety equipment reimbursement.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING SECONDARY ROAD EMPLOYEES WORK CLOTHING ALLOWANCE WHEREAS, the Shelby County Board of Supervisors wishes to continue providing Work Clothing allowance to Secondary Road Employees, and, WHEREAS, the Work Clothing allowance was removed from the Union Contract Agreement which went into effect on July 1, 2019. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SHELBY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: Each Secondary Road Employee will be allowed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) on the first pay period of the fiscal year for the purchase of work clothes. The resolution was approved after a motion by Kenkel and a second by Parkhurst to approve the resolution. Haake, Kenkel and Parkhurst all voted in favor of the resolution. The resolution was passed and adopted.

An extension of all Shelby County Covid Policies created since March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 were then extended indefinitely as most expired at the end of the year. Parkhurst made the motion to extend and Kenkel seconded the motion. Haake, Parkhurst and Kenkel voted in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Kenkel, seconded by Parkhurst that all claims filed in the Auditor's office by the Wednesday before the third Tuesday of each month shall be presented to the Board of Supervisors for approval for payment at that meeting. All claims for mileage and travel expenses must be submitted within sixty days of the date incurred. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Kenkel, that the County Auditor be authorized without prior approval of the Board to pay the wages of all County employees and to pay any other claims properly authorized by the Department Heads. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Parkhurst and seconded by Kenkel, that the following resolution be adopted after a reading by the Auditor:

The Board had received the FY2022 Health Insurance rates from the Iowa State Association of Counties. Rates will decrease because Shelby County is a part of a 23-county insurance group last year, which yielded reserves and Shelby County decreased usage enough to decrease insurance rates for fiscal year 2022, as well as the wellness program and usage. The total county rates for health insurance coverage options:

Plan 10 Family --- \$1,960.00 per month Plan 10 Single----\$ 871.00 per month Plan 12C (HSA)---\$1,641.00 per month Plan 12C (HSA)---\$ 730.00 per month.

Eligible for Family, opt out of health insurance benefit---\$490.00 per month. Eligible for Family coverage but take single coverage benefit---\$272.25 per month. Eligible for single coverage opt out of county health insurance benefit--\$217.75 per month. Parkhurst motioned to approve the health insurance costs and benefits. Kenkel seconded the motion. Kenkel, Haake and Parkhurst all voted to approve the health insurance rates for fiscal year 2021.

A motion was then made by Kenkel and seconded by Parkhurst to set wage increases for fiscal year 2022, and that noncontract employees will receive a 2% cost of living raise in wages on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. Employees qualifying with a successful evaluation completed by December 13<sup>th</sup> 2021 will be considered for a 1% raise on January 1<sup>st</sup> 2022. Kenkel, Haake and Parkhurst all voted to approve the intended wage increases for fiscal year 2022.

The board then voted after a motion by Parkhurst and a second by Kenkel to set the current fiscal year salary/stipend positions; the positions include: Wellness Coordinator \$1,000.00 with a \$500.00 bonus for getting 100% participation in the program. Safety Coordinator \$3,500.00 with a \$500.00 bonus if the mod actor used to calculate workman's comp rates falls below a factor of 1. Budget Director \$4,000.00, IT Coordinator \$2,500.00 and GIS coordinator \$2,000.00. All three Supervisors voted in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Kenkel, seconded by Parkhurst, to once again offer a \$100 incentive payment to the employees on the County's health insurance plan if 100% of employees participate in the 2021 Wellness Programs. Motion carried unanimously.

The five-event annual Roar into Harlan events were then considered after an application was placed with the Auditors office for courthouse grounds use. The events are scheduled to be held on May 20<sup>th</sup>, June 15<sup>th</sup>, July 15<sup>th</sup>, August 19<sup>th</sup> and September 16<sup>th</sup>. A motion was made by Parkhurst followed by a second by Kenkel to approve the application. All three Supervisors voted in favor of the motion.

There being no further business appearing, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned at 9:49 AM.
