

The Shelby County Board of Supervisors met in a regular session at 9:00 A.M. at the Shelby County Courthouse with the following members present: Steve Kenkel, Charles Parkhurst, Darin Haake, and Mark Maxwell, Clerk.

The Chairperson Darin Haake asked that any conflict of interest be stated concerning any item on the agenda. None were stated.

It was moved by Kenkel, seconded by Parkhurst, to approve the agenda. Item 12 was moved to a special meeting to be held on February 3rd at 1:00 PM, 1st floor of the Courthouse. It will be entirely made up of budget discussion. Motion carried unanimously.

A second was made by Parkhurst to approve publication. Haake, Kenkel and Parkhurst, all voted their approval of the motion.

Carolyn Blum, Shelby County Treasurer, then presented her semi-annual report after an explanation. Parkhurst made a motion to accept the report, Kenkel seconded the motion to approve the report. Kenkel, Haake and Parkhurst all voted in favor of accepting the report.

The Records quarterly report was then approved after a motion by Parkhurst and a second by Kenkel. The motion carried unanimously.

Vicki Kuhn was on hand to describe to the Supervisors her project, which includes taking in of stray animals. Ms. Kuhn represents the Animal Rescue League of Harlan. Her organization has found homes for 63 abandoned animals since March of 2020. The organization has built a shelter with funds collected from donations made to the non-profit group. They currently house seven cats and two dogs. Individuals giving up ownership is their greatest source of animals. Gene Gettys, Harlan City Manager provided information to the Supervisors, explaining how Ms. Kuhns organization has paired up with Harlan to assist in the abandoned animal problem in Harlan. No action was taken.

Todd Valline was on hand to present some of the upcoming events and projects his organization is involved in. Valline announced that voting has closed for the yearly Chamber Awards. Also SWIPCO approved the Harlan Chamber being the Shelby County representative for their Covid planning.

Brandon Burmeister, Shelby County Engineer, gave updates to the Supervisors including commending his employees for their response during the recent heavy snow event. Material expenses for summer projects are climbing and most materials have been purchased to complete the projects.

The annual Cost Advisory Services report was then presented to the Supervisors. Shelby County pays a yearly contract price of \$4,125.00 and are scheduled to receive back over \$21,000 in reimbursements for administrated costs in fiscal year 2022. Parkhurst made a motion to allow the Auditor to sign documentation certifying the correctness of the report.

Auditor Mark Maxwell reported to the Supervisors that the risk/exposure of the Self insurance fund for fiscal year 2019 was \$387,150.00.

Having no further business the meeting adjourned at 9:43 AM.
