The Board of Supervisors of Shelby County, Iowa, met pursuant to law and rules of said board in a special informational session at 9:00 a.m. in the Supervisors Board room in the Shelby County Courthouse. The following Elected officials were present Darin Haake, Chairman; Steve Kenkel, Vice-Chairperson; Supervisor Charles Parkhurst being on the Shelby County EMA Board was absent and Mark Maxwell, Clerk.

Representatives from companies involved in the proposed project involved. The cost of the project is estimated at 6.9 million dollars. This would be close to the same amount taxed to property owners in fiscal year 2022 Shelby County budget.

Accumulating the dollars for the project was discussed, cities and the county collecting the dollars, versus the county covering costs for every fire department and EMS in the County.

Sheriff, EMA, Fire Departments and EMS outfits will be the beneficiaries of the improved system. Public safety communication improvement would benefit.

The Supervisors requested requested the EMA Board to research the breakdown of funds available by cities/fire depts and EMA capital fund for radio purchases and total dollars needed by the county to kick off the project.
