All vendors with outstanding checks, received letters asking them to have the Shelby County issue a new check in the new software, one vendors cashed the old check after receiving the letter. This caused a double entry out of an account and the single entry recourse is not allowed by the Counties Auditors, The Treasurers office and the Auditors offices are working with the private Auditors to put the issue behind for reconciling the annual report for the fiscal year that ended June 30th.
