The Board of Supervisors of Shelby County, Iowa, met pursuant to law and rules of said board in special session at 9:00 a.m. in the Courtroom at the Shelby County Courthouse in Harlan, Iowa to accommodate social distancing and allow for room to receive an update from the health insurance representative and receive more budgets from departments. The following members were present Steve Kenkel, Chairman; Charles Parkhurst, Vice-Chairperson; Supervisor Darin Haake and Mark Maxwell, Clerk.

The meeting was called to order and it was asked by the Chairman about any conflicts of interest. None were stated.

A motion was made by Kenkel and seconded by Parkhurst to approve the agenda as presented and legally posted. A unanimous vote in favor of the agenda was then counted.
