The Shelby County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. in the Supervisors Chamber in the Courthouse with the following members present: Steve Kenkel, Charles Parkhurst, Bryce Schaben, and Mark Maxwell, Clerk.

The Chairperson, Steve Kenkel, asked that any conflict of interest be stated concerning any item on the agenda. None were stated.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Schaben, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

The agenda allowed for the opening of bids for the sale of the annex building as prescribed, no bids were received. The minimum bid required may be lowered and discussed at the next meeting. Discussion was made to the amount of \$200,000.00 for the minimum bid, no action was taken.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Schaben, to approve the latest claims for processing as listed in the claims register. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was then made by Parkhurst to approve the minutes of the May 21<sup>st</sup> Supervisors meeting. Schaben seconded the motion, the motion passed.

Jordan Sanders interim Shelby County EMS coordinator gave his monthly report on his department. Budgeting processes in the EMS department are being reviewed and possible staffing changes are being reviewed also to become more efficient departmentally.

Alex Londo, Shelby County EMA Director, told of recent meetings, put on by his department for servicing the recent weather damage in Shelby County. An estimated 70 to 100 people were present at the latest meeting with many relief organizations present to present their services and procedures. Steve Kenkel noted that officials are looking at the needs of Shelby County.

A Secondary Roads report was then given by Shelby County Engineer, Chris Frederickson. Edge blading and rock hauling are taking place. Frederickson commented that letting his office know of spots that may need rock. The Supervisors were also updated on storm damage repair at the solid waste facility. The Engineer also said that the new Assistant Engineer will be introduced at the next meeting.

Steve Kenkel reported that the nine county Mental Health Region is being reorganized and up to 17 counties may be placed into one region.

The appointment of Wren Koch as a Sheriff Deputy was then placed before the Board of Supervisors for their consideration. Schaben made a motion to approve the appointment, Parkhurst seconded the motion the motion passed.

The meeting was then adjourned.
