The Shelby County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. in the Supervisors Chamber in the Courthouse with the following members present: Bryce Schaben, Charles Parkhurst, Mike Kolbe, and Taryn Knapp, Clerk.

Chairman, Bryce Schaben, asked that any conflict of interest be stated concerning any item on the agenda. None were stated.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Kolbe, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Kolbe, seconded by Parkhurst to approve the minutes of January 2nd. Motion carried unanimously.

Todd Valline, Executive Director of the Shelby County Chamber of Commerce and Industry, was present to thank Shelby County on the successful Shop and Win promotion in December. There were over \$126,500 spent at Shelby County businesses. Valline also gave an update on CDL programs that are offered at the IWCC Campus in Harlan, upcoming Legislative Coffee, Shelby County Cattleman's Annual Banquet, and other events.

Chris Frederickson, Shelby County Engineer, gave an update on road conditions after the snow. Plows and maintainers have been out, and brushing and cleaning trees will begin soon.

The Supervisor committee reports included Bryce Schaben who said the Conservation Board is working in the Nature Center to upgrade the turtle habitat.

Geralyn Greer, Shelby County Recorder, presented her quarterly department head report. Greer then advised on the current activities including recreational vehicle renewals which were due the end of December. Boat renewal notices have been mailed out and are due April 30th. Greer also gave an update on hunting and fishing license renewals, and the modernization project legislation initiative by Recorders.

Brent Scheve from the Agency updated the Supervisors with coverages and required bonds for Shelby County. He also explained the history of County insurances and the changes over the years.
