The Shelby County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. in the Supervisors Chamber in the Courthouse with the following members present: Charles Parkhurst, Mike Kolbe, and Taryn Knapp, Clerk. Bryce Schaben by phone.

Chairman, Bryce Schaben, asked that any conflict of interest be stated concerning any item on the agenda. None were stated.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Kolbe to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Kolbe, seconded by Parkhurst to approve the minutes of October 7th, 2025, motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Kolbe to approve the latest processed claims to be paid. Motion carried unanimously.

Kylie Lange, Iowa Project Manager for Summit Carbon Solutions, provided an update on changes to the pipeline project that could affect Shelby County. Lange's update included changes to leadership with a new CEO, a new vision, mission, and values, and changes to easements offered, training for first responders, and payment options. The Supervisors then opened the meeting for public comment and questions.

Pipeline Liaison, Steve Kenkel gave a brief update on the amendment to the pipeline permit and where the litigation stands.

Engineer Chris Fredericksen asked the Supervisor's to consider approval of a ROW permit for FMCTC. Parkhurst made a motion to approve the ROW permit for FMCTC for a new line to a cell tower, Kolbe seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Chris Fredericksen, Engineer then gave a brief update on the M16 project and bridge projects. Fredericksen would once again like to thank the public for their cooperation and patience with the M16 project.

Shelby County Chamber Report by Todd Valline included event updates, vaccine clinics, and upcoming OSHA training.

Jay Ring, Weed Commissioner reported an abundance of weeds in ditches this year, along with non-native decorative grasses being planted in the ROW. If you have questions on what type of decorative grasses are native to Iowa, please contact Jay.

Geralyn Greer, Recorder, gave a quarterly report on fees collected in her office. Greer also reminded the public of recreation vehicle renewals, youth season license changes, which allows a license to be purchased until January 10th. Greer also stated a change to landowner tenant tags which are no longer specific tags. Statewide birth certificates are now available to be printed in Shelby County from 1984 forward.

Department Head reports included an update from Kenny Hansen, EMS Director. Hansen stated the new ambulance has been delivered and has already been utilized. Hansen also stated the government shutdown is affecting billing claims. There may be a decrease in revenue from billing.

Supervisor Kolbe gave a brief update on meetings he attended over the last couple weeks. Supervisor Parkhurst stated his upcoming meetings with West Central and SWIPCO. Supervisor Schaben gave an update on Hotel/Motel grants given out; the next session of grants is due in January.
