The Shelby County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. in the Supervisors Chamber in the Courthouse with the following members present: Bryce Schaben, Charles Parkhurst, Mike Kolbe, and Taryn Knapp, Clerk.

Chairman, Bryce Schaben, asked that any conflict of interest be stated concerning any item on the agenda. None were stated.

It was moved by Kolbe, seconded by Parkhurst to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Parkhurst, seconded by Kolbe to approve the minutes of October 21st, 2025, motion carried unanimously.

Pipeline Liaison, Steve Kenkel updated the Supervisors on ISAC's amicus brief in support of the Supreme Court appeal of the 8th Circuit Court's decision regarding local control.

Chris Fredericksen, Engineer then gave an update on the M16 project stating 100% of the asphalt has been laid and shoulder work will begin soon with painting lines to follow. The bridge at the intersection of 2200th and Linden Road was hit, and a new guard rail will be installed as soon as material is available. Fredericksen also stated the Railroad will begin work on street crossings beginning on 900th and moving North to Earling.

Shelby County Chamber Report by Todd Valline included food donation locations to aid families during the Government shutdown.

There were no department head reports given.

Supervisor Kolbe attended a Board of Health, Environmental Health meeting, an online MAPA meeting, as well as an online pipeline meeting. Supervisor Parkhurst attended a SWIPCO meeting. Supervisor Schaben reported a refund of over \$21,000 from the Southwest Iowa Juvenile Detention Center, Conservation Parks are now closed for the season, and the Equestrian Trail is closed through hunting season.
